Mariners and Port Users are advised that dredging activities are scheduled for Lowestoft Outer and Inner Harbour Areas as follows: -

Grab dredger UKD Cherry Sand, already working in the Harbour, will continue work until approx. 31st May. Note that vessel will not be working between 22nd and 29th May.

Working Hours: normally 0700hrs-1900hrs daily but may work split shifts (mornings and evenings), to suit tide times.

Suction Dredger Orca will commence work on approx. 10th May. Duration of work 7 days.

Working Hours: 24hrs

Timings are subject to weather and operational delays, so may change slightly.

Dredgers will display lights and shapes for dredging activities as prescribed in the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea. They will maintain a listening watch on VHF Ch 14. Vessel movements will be co-ordinated via Lowestoft Port Control.

Mariners are requested to afford dredging and survey activities a wide berth if practical and safe to do so, and to pass at slow speed.
